The students in Ms. Wolfe's 4th grade class had an opportunity to review a specific assignment they completed and also analyzed the mistakes they made. Ms. Wolfe took an opportunity to not only provide individualized feedback for each student, but also reviewed common misconceptions that she observed to her entire class. It was very powerful to listen to their class discussion and to observe the "lightbulb" moments from students when they discovered the "why" behind the errors that they made!



I am confident that our 3rd through 8th grade students are prepared for the upcoming AASA writing assessment. For example, Ms. Buckner is being INTENTIONAL with providing her students with opportunities to practice integrating the writing rubric within her instruction. Students were able to articulate the WHY behind their use of using this rubric and were able to identify areas within the rubric they were focusing on to improve their writing.
